However, the advent of streaming platforms like Netflix has fundamentally transformed how Punjabi cultural content is disseminated and received.

"Chamkila" provides a window into how digital platforms mediate cultural narratives, shape perceptions of identity, and influence the dynamics of cultural exchange on a global scale (Abidin 2022).

While "Chamkila" has the potential to celebrate and showcase Punjabi culture to a diverse audience, it also raises critical questions about authenticity, representation, and the commodification of cultural heritage (Shohat and Stam 1994). Moreover, the reception of "Chamkila" among Punjabi diasporic communities and international viewers offers insights into the negotiation of cultural belonging and the construction of hybrid identities in transnational contexts (Werbner 2002).

The current study addresses several key questions: How does "Chamkila" portray Punjabi culture, and what narratives are emphasized or neglected? To what extent does the film reflect authentic Punjabi experiences, and how might it contribute to or challenge stereotypes? How do global audiences and Punjabi diasporic communities perceive and interact with this cultural representation? Through these questions, we aim to understand the broader implications of digital media in shaping cultural identities and narratives. By focusing on "Chamkila" and its impact, this thesis aims to contribute to the ongoing discourse on language, identity, and media, highlighting the dynamic relationship between cultural representation and audience perception in an increasingly globalized world.

### **1.1 Aim of the Study**

This study aims to analyze how the Punjabi lifestyle and identity are represented in the Netflix series "Chamkila," emphasizing the position of language use. The research seeks to gain deeper expertise into how "Chamkila" constructs and portrays Punjabi cultural identity and the way those portrayals subsequently impact target market perceptions of Punjabi identity on a worldwide scale. Ultimately, this examination aspires to make contributions meaningfully to the

ongoing scholarly discourse on media illustration and cultural identification. By specializing in language as a key detail, the study aims to light up the power of language in shaping and reflecting cultural narratives inside the modern-day media landscape.

## **1.4 Significance of the Study**

This study holds importance for numerous reasons. It examines how the Punjabi way of life and identity is represented in the Netflix series "Chamkila." By reading the language use and cultural narratives in the collection, the studies shed light on how media portrayals influence target audience perceptions and the formation of cultural identification. This observation is crucial because it indicates how the Netflix display "Chamkila" allows form and reflect Punjabi identification through language. We can see how media impacts and strengthens cultural identities by looking at how language is used within the show. Additionally, it explores how "Chamkila" impacts the worldwide view of the Punjabi lifestyle, emphasizing the need for real representation in media to promote move-cultural know-how and appreciation. This study provides valuable insights into cultural and media studies by linking language, media, and identity.

## **2. Literature Review**

The impact of streaming services like Netflix on various aspects of media intake has been extensively explored. Mittell (2020) examines the anxiety among Netflix's efforts to redefine international TV achievement even as retaining facts secrecy and the demanding situations posed through conventional industry metrics (Mittell 2020). Through analysis of publicly available facts, the observant argues that Netflix tries to assemble an international and undifferentiated target market, positioning itself as the primary factor of identification for viewers (Mittell 2020). However, case research of "Fauda" and "La Casa de Papel," first of all produced for country-wide audiences earlier than Netflix involvement, spotlight the ambiguity of labeling such content "Netflix Originals" and their achievement with worldwide audiences (Mittell 2020).

Language use within media displays and shapes cultural identity. Açıkgöz applies Layoff's (1973) "Women Language Features" version to discover how girl police officers in "Unbelievable" adapt their language to navigate a male-dominated profession (Açıkgöz 2020). The observation shows that ladies may consciously alter their language patterns in positive contexts (Açıkgöz 2020). Sociolinguistics emphasizes the impact of social elements on language versions. While gender variations in language use have been explored, a gap exists regarding ladies' language in crime narratives, highlighting a want for additional research (Açıkgöz 2020). Deictic expressions play a vital position in conveying which means and relationships within narratives. Han examines the usage of Dixies in "Squid Game," identifying the man or woman Dixies because of the most frequently applied form (Han 2022). The study demonstrates how

anaphoric reference inside individual Dixies shapes conversation styles and narrative production (Han 2022).

The use of taboo language can spark controversy. Jaradat and Al Hassan (2021) inspect the use of taboo language in "Jinn," the first Jordanian Arabic supernatural collection on Netflix. Their evaluation reveals an excessive awareness of scatological and spiritual/supernatural taboo phrases, which the authors argue have been used on the whole for shock value to attract visitors. Streaming services can be precious tools for language to know. Kramersch emphasizes the importance of incorporating real materials like movies and television into language-mastering routines (Kramersch, 2018). Yurdakul and Şahin explore how Netflix series can enhance English language competencies among instructors (Yurdakul & Şahin 2021). Their findings propose that Netflix offers possibilities to research in context, grasp idiomatic terms, and expand socio-cultural knowledge, ultimately enhancing language proficiency (Yurdakul & Şahin 2021). Netflix's fulfillment is partly attributed to its ability to shape consumer engagement. Pohlmann (2018) examines binge looking-within the digital attention economic system. The look highlights how Netflix utilizes personalized guidelines and personal records to encourage binge-looking conduct, in the long run contributing to brand revitalization. Furthermore, Pohlmann (2018) also analyzes personal adaptations of the "Netflix and sit back" meme, revealing the embodied dynamics of engagement with virtual leisure platforms. This study shows that Netflix leverages playful interactivity and strategic conversation to extract value from personal data and preferences.

The way audiences consume television has been fundamentally altered by streaming services. Gray explores the evolving panorama of television consumption that specializes in how Netflix's interface and playback features rework traditional television factors to encourage binge-watching and serial skipping (Gray 2019). By reading Netflix Germany's interface, the observer demonstrates how streaming offerings both deviate from and hold conventional television practices, influencing how audiences interact with serialized content (Gray 2019).

The idea of deconstruction offers a framework for studying media. Using "Hollywood" (2020) for example, Kim (2023) exhibits how the miniseries may additionally inadvertently toughen triumphing power structures even as ostensibly tough them. This deconstructive evaluation demonstrates that media can perpetuate biases even whilst aiming to critique them.

Sexual health merchandising efforts can gain from leveraging famous streaming platforms. An examination by Lee et al. (2024) reading sexual fitness messages in young people-orientated Netflix series recognized diverse themes and delivery strategies. The evaluation highlights both fantastic aspects and concerns concerning the portrayal of sexual health statistics. Further studies are wanted to explore the long-term impact of those messages on younger visitors.

In her study, Sidney Eve Matrix examines the rapid normalization of binge-watching among television audiences, particularly teenagers, due to Netflix's popularity (Matrix 2018). This shift has prompted networks, content producers, and distributors to increasingly offer shows targeted at young viewers through on-demand streaming services, over-the-top platforms, and mobile apps. The essay delves into the debates and discussions in the media about the effects of an on-demand media culture, highlighting how the abundance of viewing choices, the immediate gratification provided by converged media, and the digital social interactions around TV shows are creating new ways for youth to engage with television.

In October 2006, Netflix released a dataset containing 100 million anonymous movie ratings and issued a challenge to the data mining, machine learning, and computer science communities to surpass the accuracy of its recommendation system, Cinematics. This challenge, known as the Netflix Prize, incentivized participants to improve the root mean squared error (RMSE) of predictions compared to the Cinematics baseline (Bennett and Lanning, 2018). Netflix's

recommendation system, which had been enhancing its algorithms since the late 1990s, aimed to connect subscribers with movies they would enjoy to maintain and grow their subscriber base. By October 2006, Netflix had accumulated over 1.9 billion ratings from 11.7 million subscribers on more than 85,000 titles, highlighting the critical role of accurate recommendations in its business model. The dataset provided for the competition included ratings from 480,000 randomly chosen, anonymous subscribers on nearly 18,000 movie titles, collected between October 1998 and December 2005. Competitors had to predict withheld ratings and were scored based on RMSE, with the grand prize awarded for a 10% improvement over Cinematch's performance. By June 2007, over 20,000 teams from 152 countries had registered, with significant engagement and collaboration on the Netflix Prize Forum. The progress and techniques shared by participants, such as the implementation of Singular Value Decomposition (SVD) by Brandyn Webb (aka "Simon Funk") and Vincent DiCarlo, contributed to substantial improvements in predictive accuracy (Bennett & Lanning, 2018). The Netflix Prize also provided a valuable dataset for non-commercial research, such as the KDD Cup 2007, which included tasks like predicting future movie ratings and the number of ratings certain movies would receive. The competition underscored the potential of collaborative filtering and advanced machine learning techniques in enhancing recommendation systems, fostering innovation, and knowledge sharing in the field (Bennett & Lanning, 2018).

It intersects with key concepts from the literature on streaming services. Mittell discusses Netflix's global audience strategy, which relates to how "Chamkila" represents Punjabi culture to a worldwide viewership (Mittell, 2018). Sociolinguistic theories by Açıkgöz and Han highlight how language use in media reflects and shapes cultural identities, pertinent to analyzing the Punjabi language in "Chamkila" (Açıkgöz, 2020; Han, 2022).

Açıkgöz's study on language adaptation in media can be extended to understand how "Chamkila" characters navigate cultural settings through language (Açıkgöz, 2020). Han's work on Dixies in "Squid Game" informs how linguistic features in "Chamkila" contribute to narrative meaning to show how media influences audience perceptions and norms, relevant to "Chamkila"'s impact on Punjabi culture understanding (Jaradat & Al Hassan, 2021).

Kramsch and Yurdakul and Şahin emphasize the media's educational potential, suggesting "Chamkila" could enhance Punjabi language and cultural knowledge (Kramsch, 2024). Pohlmann and Gray discuss Netflix's strategies to engage viewers, which can be applied to understand how "Chamkila" maintains viewer interest and shapes cultural narratives (Pohlmann 2018; Gray, 2019). These insights help analyze "Chamkila" in terms of linguistic elements and cultural representation on Netflix.

### **3.Methodology**

#### **3.1 Research Method**

This study employs a qualitative research method to explore the portrayal of Punjabi identity within the Netflix series "Chamkila". The selection of this method is due to the definition by Taylor (2016), who stated: "The broader scope of qualitative research is to explore descriptive data from people's own spoken or written words and behaviors". The importance of qualitative research is that the meaning is constructed socially. The qualitative approach allows for an in-depth examination of the series as a cultural artifact, enabling a nuanced exploration of how language constructs and portrays cultural identity in the narrative. Narrative analysis further enriches the research by uncovering how the show's plot structure and character development shape the portrayal of language and cultural themes.

#### **3.2 Research Design**

The secondary research design used in this study follows qualitative content analysis. The selection of this design is to systematically examine the content of "Chamkila" to identify

recurring themes and patterns associated with the portrayal of Punjabi identity. The research aims to illuminate how "Chamkila" contributes to the portrayal and global understanding of Punjabi identity.

### **3.3 Data Collection Techniques: Scene and Dialogue Selection**

A multi-step technique was employed to select scenes and dialogues for analysis. Initially, the entire film was viewed with careful attention to communication, visuals, and narrative elements depicting language use and cultural representation. Specific scenes and dialogues were then selected based on their exemplification of themes identified during the preliminary viewing.

### **3.4 Transcription and Note-Taking**

Selected scenes and dialogues were transcribed verbatim, capturing speech exchanges and relevant background information. Detailed notes were taken during the viewing process, recording observations, interpretations, and emerging themes related to language and identity. These notes are critical for later analysis and categorization. For example, detailed note-taking involves recording observations about tone of voice, body language, and facial expressions used by characters during specific language interactions

### **3.5 Visual Analysis**

While the primary focus remained on communication, visual elements such as clothing, setting, and cultural practices in selected scenes were also analyzed. Screenshots or detailed descriptions were collected to complement the transcribed dialogue and provide a richer context for understanding the interwoven nature of language and culture. This included analyzing the significance of traditional clothing worn by characters during a wedding ceremony, or the symbolism associated with specific colors or patterns used in the set design of a rural village scene.

### **3.6 Theoretical Framework**

The study is grounded in the theory of language and identity, positing that language is crucial for cultural identity, conveying cultural values, beliefs, and norms (Makoni & Pennycook, 2007). Language reflects cultural identity and plays a significant role in its production and negotiation within communities (Blommaert, 2010).

The Netflix movie "Chamkila" provides a compelling exploration of modern Punjabi tradition, using the theory of language and identity to analyze its portrayal of the complex relationship between language use, cultural representation, and the development of character and community identities. This framework argues that language is more than just communication; it is a fundamental aspect of cultural identity (Makoni & Pennycook, 2007). It serves as a marker of social hierarchy, reflects cultural values, and plays a pivotal role in shaping self-perception and community interaction (Blommaert, 2010).

Within "Chamkila," language choices serve as potent markers of identity, revealing characters' social status, cultural heritage, and sense of belonging. For example, the use of respectful terms in Punjabi such as "Ji" or "Tauji" (uncle) when addressing elders underscores the characters' adherence to traditional family values and hierarchy (Kaur, 2014). This linguistic practice reinforces social order within the village community and emphasizes the importance of respect for elders (Gumperz, 1982).

The dynamism of Punjabi culture is further highlighted in the film through the practice of code-switching, where characters switch between languages or dialects within a single conversation (Rampton 91). In one scene, Chamkila performs for a wealthy audience in the city, beginning with Punjabi and seamlessly transitioning into Urdu, reflecting his attempt to negotiate his identity and connect with diverse audiences while maintaining cultural authenticity (Gumperz 80). Analysis of these language shifts provides insight into characters' internal conflicts as they navigate a culturally diverse world (Gómez et al, 1982).

Language in "Chamkila" transcends its role as a communication tool; it serves as a powerful force in community building and maintenance (Makoni & Pennycook, 2007). For instance, a vibrant Punjabi wedding scene in the film illustrates how shared language fosters camaraderie and strengthens social bonds within the community (Blommaert 2010). Examining language's function in these communal spaces helps understand its role in reinforcing the social fabric of Punjabi culture and cultivating a shared sense of identity among its members (Gumperz, 1982).

While the language and identity theory provides a solid framework for understanding the film, the multifaceted nature of Punjabi culture demands a broader perspective. Scenes depicting Chamkila interacting with urban youth who blend Punjabi, Urdu, and English slang highlight the hybrid nature of contemporary Punjabi culture, which integrates traditional and modern influences (Shohamy, 2006). Understanding and analyzing this hybridity moves beyond simplistic rural versus urban or traditional versus modern dichotomies, acknowledging the dynamic evolution of Punjabi culture while preserving its core identity (Kaur, 2014).

The language and identity theory offers a valuable framework for analyzing "Chamkila," examining how language choices, dialects, and code-switching shape cultural identity in the film, providing deeper insights into its characters and the multifaceted tapestry of Punjabi culture they represent. "Chamkila" transcends mere entertainment, offering a thought-provoking exploration of identity, culture, and the evolving role of language in a globalized world.

#### **4. Analysis**

"Amar Singh Chamkila" is a Netflix original biographical film that delves into the life and career of the iconic Punjabi singer Amar Singh Chamkila. Directed by a notable filmmaker and featuring a talented cast, the film explores Chamkila's rise to fame, his controversial lyrics, and his tragic death, providing a comprehensive look at his impact on Punjabi music and culture.

##### **4.1 Language and Identity Construction in "Chamkila"**

Language is fundamental to identity construction, serving as a primary means through which cultural narratives are communicated and preserved. In "Chamkila," the Punjabi language is not merely a communicative tool but a cultural marker that signifies belonging, heritage, and community. The series' dialogue, music, and cultural references are steeped in the Punjabi vernacular, which authenticates the narrative and strengthens the portrayal of a distinct cultural identity. The characters' use of idiomatic expressions, regional dialects, and cultural references embedded in their speech patterns underscore the importance of linguistic authenticity in media representations.

One of his best scenes is where he is giving an interview to a journalist wearing a 'jean-pant' and cannot meet her eyes. Or that particular moment when he is not able to say no to the public's demand to sing his old 'halke-ashleel game.' There's this one dialogue in the film that takes a low blow at the character of Chamkila, stating,

"Uski fitrat abhi bhi naukro wali hai."

This dialogue stands true for Chamkila as he is never able to forget that he is a lower-caste and uneducated nobody from a small village. This is evident when he tells the same reporter,

"Mein bohat chhota aadmi hu ji, aur zyadatar log mere jaise hi hai".

The same emotion is evident in another scene where he gets upset when told that his show has sold more seats than Amitabh Bachchan.

##### **4.2 Code-Switching Dynamics**

Moreover, the strategic use of Punjabi alongside other languages in "Amar Singh Chamkila" highlights the dynamics of code-switching, which is a common phenomenon in multilingual societies. For instance, in a poignant scene where Chamkila explains his approach to music, he switches between Punjabi and Hindi to emphasize different aspects of his life and career, reflecting his socio-economic background and the various social contexts he navigates. This bilingualism bridges cultural gaps for a diverse audience and showcases the fluid and dynamic

nature of cultural identity in a globalized world. This linguistic fluidity emphasizes the adaptability of Punjabi culture while preserving its core identity, contributing to a nuanced understanding of cultural hybridity.

#### **4.3 Implications for Global Perception**

The portrayal of Punjabi culture in "Amar Singh Chamkila" has significant implications for global perceptions of Punjabi identity. The film acts as a cultural ambassador, presenting viewers with a rich tapestry of Punjabi traditions, values, and everyday life. In a scene where Chamkila passionately defends his lyrics to a female journalist criticizing their objectification of women, he retorts,

"Main Jeevan di larai vich itna fasiya hoya haan ke changa ate manda sochan da samah hi nahin mil da."

"I am too preoccupied with survival to consider good and evil,"

Challenging stereotypical representations and offering a more complex and authentic narrative. This global platform allows for a wider appreciation and recognition of Punjabi culture, fostering a sense of pride among Punjabi viewers and promoting cultural empathy among non-Punjabi audiences.

#### **4.4 Cultural Representation**

From a theoretical perspective, the intersection of language and identity in "Amar Singh Chamkila" can be analyzed through the lens of sociolinguistics and cultural studies. Sociolinguistic theories suggest that language is a key component of social identity, reflecting and shaping an individual's sense of self and belonging. Cultural studies further argue that media representations play a pivotal role in constructing and disseminating cultural identities. In a scene where Chamkila sings new songs and practices on a street during a magic-hour glow, we see how language not only reflects cultural identity but also actively constructs it within the narrative, embodying the artist's connection to his cultural roots and his influence on the people around him.

#### **4.5 Performative Identity in "Chamkila"**

The film also engages with the concept of performative identity, where language and cultural practices are seen as performative acts that continuously shape and reshape identity. By portraying characters who navigate multiple cultural contexts and linguistic landscapes, "Amar Singh Chamkila" demonstrates how identity is not a static attribute but an ongoing process of negotiation and performance. This is evident in Chamkila's interactions with various groups, such as godmen and radicals, law enforcement, and competitors, where his responses and musical choices reflect a continuous negotiation of his artistic and personal identity. As Chamkila himself states in the film,

"Bhaven main dosti da dabav man ke sharaarti ton bhajan gaayak ban bhi jaavan, phir vi koi jeet nahi hai."

"Even if I give in to peer pressure and transform from provocateur to devotional vocalist, there is no winning."

This performative aspect of identity is crucial in understanding how individuals and communities adapt to and resist cultural changes while maintaining a sense of continuity.

#### **4.6 Broader Implications of Cultural Representation**

"Chamkila" addresses the broader implications of cultural representation in media. By providing a platform for Punjabi voices and stories, the film challenges the dominant cultural narratives that often marginalize minority cultures. The opening scene, showing the murders of Chamkila and Amarjot, sets a tone that critiques societal hypocrisy and violence against dissenting voices. This representation is particularly important in a global media landscape where cultural hegemonies tend to dominate. "Chamkila" thus contributes to a more pluralistic and inclusive



media environment, where diverse cultural identities can be celebrated and understood on their terms.

The film "Chamkila" offers a compelling study for examining the role of language in the construction and reinforcement of Punjabi identity.
